Romans 16

1. <u>Intro</u>

- 1. Paul has reviewed his ministry. He talked about his past, talked about his present situation and tells them his desire for his future.
- 2. In closing Paul extends greetings to the church in Rome.
 - 1. In doing so, he weaves into his writings three ideas:
 - 1. Social composition; an organizational structure and the importance of women

2. Letter Delivered

- 1. Phoebe
 - 1. Phoebe carried the letter from Paul to Rome
 - 2. She was from Cenchrea which was just east of Corinth
 - 3. Had some type of leadership role.
 - 4. Had assisted Paul in his work. Enough so that he trusted her with this letter.
- 2. Paul, in closing, mentions many people by name and what they may have been involved in.
 - 1. We can glean from this a bit about the early church.

3. Early Church Structure

- 1. Social
 - 1. Many names suggest freed slaves
 - 1. servants mentioned specifically in v 10 & 11
 - 2. Most likely many of the early church common people
 - 2. Some are of means
 - 1. Household of Aristobulus; Narcissus(10-11)
 - 2. We see Priscilla and Aquila moving around suggesting that they had the money to do so (tent maker)
 - 3. God has a concern for the poor and hopeless; but anyone can come to Him.

2. Organizational

- 1. House churches mentioned in v. 5, 14, 15.
- 2. House churches necessary early on.
 - 1. Seemed to have a loose structure
 - 2. Not necessary "the way".
- 3. Need to function together (not compete)
 - 1. Maybe why Paul wrote chp 14

3. Women

- 1. Women make up a good portion of the church (about 1/3 as mentioned)
- 2. Have the same access to God as men.
- 3. Engaged in significant ministry
 - 1. Phoebe some sense of leadership (1)
 - 2. Priscilla and Aquila Paul's co-workers (3)
 - 3. Mary (6)

- 4. Andronicus and Junia husband and wife team? (7)
- 5. Tryphena and Tryphosa sister? (12)
- 4. Are important asset to God's program

4. Beware

- 1. Paul warns against false teachers
 - 1. Serve their own interest (18a)
 - 2. Are good talkers (smooth) (18b)
 - 3. End up causing division (17b)

5. Conclusion

- 1. As we minister we should encourage our brothers and sisters as they work along side of us.
 - 1. Paul needed and received help from a variety of places.
- 2. We cannot go it alone.
- 3. Each of us has a role to play as the Church of Jesus Christ goes forward.
